What You Can Learn...

Introduction to Music 5-7 years

A fun class for 5-7 year olds where they learn about music through rhythm, action songs and games. This runs for two terms of the year.

Violin 5+ years

There's a violin for every size! The Suzuki method of learning means students can start young. Parental participation is important too.



Singing 6+ years

Physical warm-ups, vocal exercises and singing songs based on classical techniques make these classes fun for kids who love to sing!

Ukulele 6+ years

For all those keen guitarists not yet big enough to handle a guitar.

Recorder 6+ years

Students enjoy learning to read music while playing familiar tunes. This sets them up nicely to progress onto other instruments such as fife, flute, clarinet, saxophone and keyboard.



Fife 7+ years

An alternative to the recorder, this is a great wee instrument for any aspiring flute player.

Speech & Drama 7+ years

An informal introduction to speech including improvisation, voice, poetry and drama, conversation and more! More advanced work for returning students

Theory of Music 7+ years

Note reading, rhythm, musical notation... useful for everyone! This is a great class to take alongside an instrument.



Guitar 8+ years

Get strumming in a guitar class! Students learn chords in their first year, adding some picking as they progress.

Drumming 8+ years

For the kids who love rhythm! No drum kit is needed - just a practice pad and sticks.



Participation in the following classes relies on the student being physically able to manage the instrument....

Bass Guitar (Advanced) 9+ years

Students can start from scratch but it's better to have played guitar for a couple of years to build up chord knowledge. Bass classes are great for that extra dimension to playing the guitar.

Cello 8+ years

Enjoy the mellow sounds of the cello - a big string instrument you can hug. Cellos come in sizes to fit all ages. Like the bass guitar, cellos are always needed to play in groups.

Clarinet 9+ years

* Part of the woodwind family, the clarinet is a lovely instrument to learn and uses similar fingering to the recorder. As well as the instrument you'll need a supply of reeds for the mouthpiece.

Cornet 9+ years

The cornet is a very portable brass instrument with a bright, cheerful tone. It's a great choice if you enjoy playing with others.

Flute 9+ years

* The flute is an expressive, dynamic & versatile instrument. The flute is similar to recorder in that it uses almost the same fingering, notes are also written in the treble clef, and it's extremely portable!

Piano/Keyboard 9+ years

Learn to read and play music, mostly a right-hand melody with left-hand accompaniment. It is essential for students to have a functioning instrument at home to practise on.

Saxophone 9+ years

* The saxophone is a punchy instrument with an exciting and colorful extended range. We recommend you learn clarinet before taking up the saxophone. A supply of reeds will be needed.

* Please note that at least one year of recorder or fife, or previous music reading experience is a pre-requisite for flute, clarinet or saxophone classes.
